

## **Women's Soccer: No. 3 Seed Hawks Soar over Palomar, 7-2;**

*SCC opens playoffs with early four-goal barrage en route to program's inaugural post-season win.*

Coming out with a scoring barrage unlike that ever seen in its modest five-season existence, the Santiago Canyon College (SCC) Hawks women's soccer team – the No. 3-seeded team in the region – scored four goals in a six-minute span and overwhelmed the visiting (and No. 14-seeded) Palomar College Comets, 7-2, in a Southern California Regional Playoff first-round game Tuesday night (Nov. 16) at SCC Soccer Field.

In the regional playoffs for the fourth consecutive year and opening post-conference competition at home for the second straight season, the SCC Hawks – in the midst of their best season in club history at 17-1-2 – more than made amends for three previous playoff appearances which ended with shutout losses.

SCC freshman forward Kim Horn (Capistrano Valley H.S.) scored at the 11, 16, and 17-minute marks for her 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> goals of the season – and freshman forward Jessica Suszek (Capistrano Valley H.S.) tallied her third goal of the season, this one in the 12<sup>th</sup> minute – as the Hawks raced to a 4-0 lead.

Horn's first tally of the game came from about 20 yards out off an assist from Suszek. Horn's rolling shot seemed to be misread by Palomar freshman goalkeeper Brittany Quillin (Vista H.S.) and scooted past her and into the goal just inside the right goalpost. In the next minute, a bit of role reversal took place when Suszek took a feed from Horn and blasted a 15-yard effort also just inside the right goalpost.

Four minutes later, Horn garnered a centering pass from freshman forward Rachel Housepian (El Toro H.S.), dribbled into the 18-yard box and let loose with a blast from 15 yards away. One minute later, Horn headed home the ball from four yards away after freshman Heather Dorscht (Loara H.S.) set her up with a beautifully executed cross from the right side.

Palomar – which finished at 10-5-5 overall – got back into the game with goals by freshman Tasha Stark (Temecula Chaparral H.S.) – her sixth of the season – in the 26<sup>th</sup> minute and by sophomore Chiharu Uchimura (Urawanish H.S., Japan) – her 13<sup>th</sup> of the campaign – in the 38<sup>th</sup> minute.

Housepian gave SCC a 5-2 halftime advantage when her rolling shot from seven yards away deflected off a Palomar defender and caromed into the goal in the game's 41<sup>st</sup> minute for her 19<sup>th</sup> goal of the season.

In the second half, sophomore forward Ally Basehart (Rosary H.S.) scored her fifth goal of the season (in the 71<sup>st</sup> minute) off an assist from sophomore forward e Darlene Sasso (El Toro H.S.) and sophomore forward Monica Mora (Valencia H.S.) notched her fourth goal of the season (in the 82<sup>nd</sup> minute) off an assist from freshman Kristyn Lucas (Mission Viejo H.S.) to cap the scoring.

Sophomore goalkeeper Christina Graul (San Clemente H.S.) played the first 84 minutes for SCC, faced five shots and made three saves before yielding to freshman Whitney Bailey (Fountain Valley H.S.) who played six minutes and saved the only shot she faced.

For Palomar, Quillin went the distance, faced 25 shots and made nine saves.

The SCC 1-2 scoring punch of Horn and Housepian continued its assault on the Hawks' record books.

Horn leads SCC (28 goals, 17 assists, 73 points) and led the OEC (22 goals, 14 assists, 58 points) in goals, assists and points, extending her current record-shattering numbers in all three categories. Housepian is next with 19 goals, 15 assists, and 53 points overall (and had 17 goals, 11 assists, and 45 points in OEC play).

SCC – which reached the playoffs thanks to a 14-1-1 record in Orange Empire Conference (OEC) play – gained a share of the OEC championship, along with defending conference champion Cypress College (18-1-1, 14-1-1), which is the No. 1 seed.

In the latest National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) rankings, SCC is tenth nationally (as of Nov. 9). Four-time defending state champion, Long Beach City College (17-0-0), is ranked first nationally – and has been all season – but is seeded No. 2 in the south regional playoffs.

Palomar finished third (9-2-3) in the Pacific Coast Conference behind No. 4 seed San Diego Mesa College and No. 12 seed Grossmont College. With Tuesday's win, SCC leads Palomar in the all-time series, 1-0-1, including a 1-1 tie (Sep. 3).

With the win, SCC advances to the second round of playoff action and will host the No. 6-seeded Ventura College Pirates (14-3-2) – and nine-time champions of the Western State Conference – on Saturday, Nov. 20, at 2 p.m. at SCC Soccer Field. Ventura posted a 4-0 home win over No. 11 seed Mt. San Antonio (10-6-3).

Saturday's SCC-Ventura victor will face the winner of the game between No. 2-seed Long Beach City and No.-10 seed Moorpark in the third round of the regional playoffs set for Tuesday, Nov. 23.

Third-round winners advance to the state championships (final four) that will be held on Saturday-Sunday, Dec. 4-5, at Oxnard College.

Heading into Saturday, SCC fifth-year head women's soccer coach, Ian Woodhead (Portsmouth Polytechnic, UK) has compiled an overall won-lost record of 64-28-11.
