Presidents Report

- The COA web site has SCOPE information included on it. If you go to the left side of the main page and scroll down you will find SCOPE.
- Your President met at the Capitol with Senator Torlakson (D-Antioch) about legislation which was adopted to revise K-12 PE curriculum and to enforce the total hours of mandated PE in K-12 by the State (many K-12 Districts have been found not have been teaching the mandated minimum hours for K-12 Physical Education). As part of this legislation all PE teachers and administrators are required to get training on how to implement this new curriculum (which was developed by the UC Berkeley Center for PE). I offered the CCC's to offer courses to train these K-12 personnel as a local, cost-effective option. The training has yet to be implemented. Also in attendance were personnel from the California Health Initiative and representatives from K-12 Physical Education groups.
- We are looking for nominations for President-Elect and Treasurer/Membership Officer. Nomination forms are available online on our web site mentioned above. Elections will take place at the April COA meeting.
- Membership forms were mailed out from Sierra College on October 9th. Membership forms are also available online on our web site.

Treasury Report

- All bills have been paid and we currently have \$2,828 in our treasury.
- SCOPE will use the money in the treasury as of November 10th to decide how to lobby the legislature.

Membership Report

- Membership is low since the membership solicitation was late in getting sent out due to an error made by the President. Many members for 06-07 are lifetime members.

Constitutional Changes

- There were no constitution changes recommended.

Minimum Qualifications Revisions

- Diane Henry reported that our revisions were denied last year by the State-Wide Academic Senate, due to a protest from SBCC on Sports Administration majors.
- Diane Henry is working on a committee with Jim Forkum-Sierra to recommend changes to the list.
- SCOPE discussed and issued support for addition of yoga to the list which requires an AA + 6 or BA/BS +2 for nationally certified yoga instructors to gain an MQ. This proposal came from Carol Knight of West Valley CC.

Legislative Update

- Carlyle Carter-Executive Director of the COA reported that AB 2165 was voted into law and will take effect as of Jan 1, 2007. This law does not allow anyone who commits a number of crimes, mainly felonies, eligible for athletics if they are sentenced after first enrollment at a CCC until they finish their sentence and or probation. The COA is looking at adding a line on the Form 1 to ask the students to check, yes or no, for this with a penalty of perjury if they are not honest with their answer.

Foothill Survey

- The Foothill College survey was distributed. This survey lists the top courses which lead to the most FTES for each college (that responded to the survey).

Hot Topics

- Use of College facilities by non-PE faculty-most colleges make other faculty enroll in courses, use their fitness center, enroll in a campus wellness plan or enroll in Non-credit courses in PE to use facilities.
- There is a MIS study state-wide to map curriculum to be able to recognize curriculum which has changed names since 1992. This is to identify articulation for courses whose names might have changed.
