STATE FINALS REPORT

Once again, congratulations to all participants of Women's Golf in the State of California. We are really proud of the advancement of Women's Golf this year. Leading up to the State Championships, conferences up and down the state competed for championships, both on the team level as well as individual play. We believe that the level of competition will improve as the years progress. Keep working!

The 2001 California State Finals were held at beautiful Del Rio CC in Modesto. Gary Ard was the hosting coach, and provided a great venue for this year's tournament. We were again lucky as the weather held up during the two day event. In attendance again was Debra Wheeler and COA Rep, Diane Henry.

Gary Peterson's Cougar's from College of the Desert shot a two day total of 697 to claim the championship from Mt. San Antonio. Stan Gonta's Mounties shot a 716 to finish in the runner up position. American River finished 3rd with a total of 755 and Fresno City rounded out the teams with a 4th place finish and a score of 778. Congratulations to all of the team members for a great season.

The individual championships were won by Jennifer Stopka of Moorpark College. Jen shot a 86 –78 for a medalist score of 164. Jeri Costello of Fullerton finished as runner up with a 87 – 78 for a two day total of 165. Courtney Renfro of Canyons finished 3rd with a 167 and Susan Latch, also of Canyons finished with a total of 168. Min Hee Hwang of Mt. Sac finished with 169 and Valarie Ogawa of Foothill finished 6th with a 170.

The 2002 State Finals will be held in Lompoc, at La Purisima GC. Will Thurston will host along with the Western State Conference. Western State hosted the 2001 So. Cal regional tournament and was certainly a beautiful setting at the La Purisima GC.

Meeting notes:

1. All golf coaches should join the CCCLGCA. Dues = \$35
2. Locate the banner used at 2000 State Finals at the Desert.
It was voted on by the membership in attendance to purchase a banner for both the North and South for regional tournaments.
3. Gary Engelken passed away this summer. Gary was the Treasurer for the organization.
4. Form 5's
 - a. 6.1.f. add "regional". There shall be no substitutes after the start of Regionals or State Tournament.
 - b. Only the head coach or his/her designee may coach from green to tee as long as it does not interfere with pace of play or other players.

- c. **Rule 8 of USGA. Players will not be allowed to seek out or give advise to other players.**
- d. **2.A add Tuesday. All conference competition shall be completed no later than the 1st Mon/Tues in November.**
- e. **4.C.4 Change 18 to 36 Holes. Easily accommodate the number of participants in the regional for 36 holes of championship play.**
- f. **Weather. When there is unclement weather, the Tournament committee will make the decision how the tournament will be handled.**
- g. **4.2.B The event must start prior to 9:00 A.M. each day, unless a shot gun format. The event must start no later than 10:00 A.M.**

There was a question by Sue Scott of ARC who commented that she thought that the president would alternate from South to North, etc,. I looked into the CCCLGCA constitution and it was not stated as such. Therefore, Will Thurston will serve a 2 year term as President. Congratulations, Will.**

CONSTITUTION

**ARTICLE I
NAME**

The name of the organization shall be the California Community College Ladies Golf Coaches Association. (CCCLGCA)

**ARTICLE II
PURPOSE**

The purpose of CCCLGCA shall be:

- 1. To develop within the coaches of our organization a sense of responsibility in maintaining and conducting athletics on a high standard.**
- 2. To foster sportsmanship of our golf teams both on and off the course.**
- 3. To continue to improve the standards of the game of golf.**
- 4. To keep coaches informed on issues that affect California Community College Golf.**
- 5. To recruit and maintain a membership representative of all Community Colleges in California.**
- 6. To establish policies and procedures that are in the best interest of the players, coaches, and golf conferences in the state of California.**
- 7. To work with the Commission on Athletics (COA) in the achievement of these goals.**

**ARTICLE III
MEMBERSHIP**

All California Community College Golf Coaches, honorary members, and other selected persons shall be eligible for membership. There shall be three types of memberships in the By-Laws.

- 1. Active Membership**
 - 2. Associate Membership**
 - 3. Honorary Membership**
 - 4. Ex officio Members Agree ___ Disagree ___**
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**ARTICLE IV
GOVERNING BODY**

The executive Committee of the CCCLGCA shall be the governing body of this organization.

**ARTICLE V
BY-LAWS**

The CCCLGCA may adopt By-Laws by a simple majority vote of eligible members present at the Annual Business meeting.

A. Membership

1. Active membership - Open to individuals actively in coaching golf in California Community Colleges and who are current in their dues.
2. Associated membership – Open to all four year college and university coaches.
3. Honorary membership
 - a. shall be presented to any individual who has made a valuable contribution to the Community College Golf program.
 - b. Shall be for the life of the individual
4. Ex officio - COA Reps. (Asst. to the Commissioner/Management council Rep) Agree___ Disagree___

B. Dues

1. All Head Coaches and ssistant coaches shall pay membership dues to the CCCLGCA.
2. Membership dues must be paid on or before August 1
3. The amount of dues fee shall be determined annually by the Executive Committee.
4. Honorary members shall be exempt from all fees and dues.

**ARTICLE VI
AMENDMENTS**

This constitution may be amended by the majority vote of the CCCLGCA members present.

A. ORGANIZATION

1. Annual Business Meeting shall be conducted at the State Championships.
2. Membership at Business Meeting may:
 - a. Recommend to the Executive Committee changes in the State Golf Supplement.
 - b. Recommend to the Executive Committee any additional changes pertinent to golf issues.

B. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

1. The Officers of this committee are: president, president-elect, past president, and secretary-treasurer.
2. Voting members shall include: president, president-elect, past president, administrative assistant, and one rep from each conference in the state (executive rep). There shall be no proxy voting.
3. The State COA Golf Representative and the State Tournament Director shall be a non-voting member of this committee.

4. **Executive Representatives** must be golf coaches and shall be selected by their respective conferences.
 5. **Alternates** – Each conference in the state shall be responsible for selecting an alternative rep who must also be a golf coach. The alternate may attend all Executive Committee meetings but shall have no voting privileges unless the Executive Representative is not in attendance.
 6. **Meetings**
 - a. Additional meetings shall be held as deemed necessary by the CCCLGCA president.
 - b. Only Executive Committee members, Tournament Director and COA Representative may attend meetings. The President may grant permission for other individuals to attend, if their presence involves business or other related issues pertinent to our organization.
- C. GENERAL DUTIES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**
1. Attend all executive Committee meetings.
 2. Review recommended changes in the State Golf Supplement and adopt by a majority vote of the Executive Committee members in attendance (with COA approval)
 3. Review recommended changes pertinent to other golf issues and adopt by a majority vote of the Executive Committee members in attendance (with COA approval)
 4. Nominate and select CCCLGCA officers as deemed necessary by expiration term of service. The committee shall nominate at least one candidate for each office.
 5. Select a State Tournament Director.
- D. SPECIFIC DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**
1. **PRESIDENT**
 - A. Chair the CCCLGCA meeting.
 - B. Chair the CCCLGCA meeting
 - C. Secure a meeting facility for the Executive Committee meetings.
 - D. Request agenda items from Executive Committee members two weeks prior to each meeting.
 - E. Notify Executive Committee members of the following information:
 1. Date, time and place of meeting
 2. Agenda items
 3. Recommendations from the business meetings (South & North)
 - F. Inform Executive Committee members, in writing, regarding changes or information pertinent to the following
 1. Policies and procedures
 2. State Supplement
 3. Additional golf issues
 4. COA guidelines and policies
 - G. Perform the following duties related to the Commission on Athletics (COA)
 1. Act as a liaison between the CCCLGCA and the COA
 2. Attend all the COA meetings and represent the CCCLGCA regarding policies, procedures and any additional issues relative to golf.
 - H. Carry out any additional duties that are pertinent to this association.

E. TERMS OF OFFICE

PRESIDENT2 YEARS

PRESIDENT-ELECT.....2 YEARS

SECRETARY-TREASURER.....2 YEARS

- 1. If a member of the Executive Committee is unable to fulfill their term of office or is removed from office, the President or the President-Elect shall contact the Conference Representative who shall notify the alternative regarding the vacated position. NOTE: The Conference Rep is an Athletic Director or a Conference Designee who is in charge of conducting their conference golf meetings.**
- 2. Executive Committee members may be removed from office at any time by this committee, if said member does not attend meetings and/or perform his/her assigned duties.**
- 3. The officers of the Executive Committee shall have the right and obligation to take action on any matter not specifically covered in this manual.**
- 4. Officers will begin their term: July 1 – June 30**
- 5. Constitution changes will be in effect immediately following the state tournament.**
