(C) October Meeting

- (2) Ensure that, at least, the Management Council meets

Annual Spring Meeting

Two formats will be presented to the body to see which one they want to use in June. One has all the workshops in two days while the other has workshops spread throughout three days.

Snuggs will make sure that the awards are done. The Caulkins will do the socials.

Cost Savings

Conference representatives reported as follows:
Western States- will play 20% less games

Coast- will cut cost of officials by 30%
will maximize conference competition
Bay Valley- letter written to college presidents
may reduce number of officials

Possible Coast Savings Opportunities

The Executive Committee recommended the following to be presented to the main body from the document "CCCADA Executive Committee/Possible Coast Saving Opportunities":

GENERAL RECOMMENDATIONS

(1) Reduction of 10% contests for football and cross county (scrimmage counts as a contest)

Reduction of 20% of contests for baseball and softball

Reduction of 15% of contests for all remaining sports.

All contests will be rounded down.

(2) It was ms/carried to maintain state championships, but have

-more geographic match ups

-more time schedules

-eliminate one overnight

More discussion will follow at the main meeting.

(3) Reduce costs of officials fees by 30%
