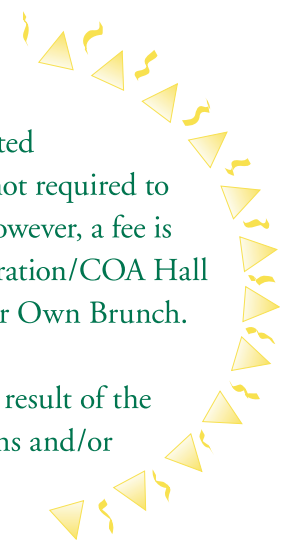

COA 8TH ANNUAL CONVENTION

The 8th annual COA convention is open to all members of the college community, including classified staff, eligibility clerks, counselors, student service deans, chief executive officers and, as always, a mix of business and affiliate organization sessions for athletic directors, coaches, counselors/advisors, sports information personnel, SCOPE faculty, athletic classified staff and athletic trainers.

All COA CONVENTION ATTENDEES ARE ELIGIBLE FOR STAFF DEVELOPMENT FUNDING.
EXAMPLES OF AVAILABLE FUNDING ENTITIES AT EACH COLLEGE INCLUDE:

- ▶ Staff development funds (see your staff development coordinator)
- ▶ Technology training funds (TTIP)
- ▶ Division deans/department chairs
- ▶ Vocational education funding
- ▶ Office of Instruction (especially for professional development sessions)
- ▶ Partnership for Excellence funds (look at your district plan for use of PFE funds)
- ▶ College president
- ▶ Local faculty union
- ▶ Local faculty senate
- ▶ Student activities fund or student government. Bring a student with you and sometimes they will fund both of you. Be the student's sponsor or mentor.
- ▶ College foundations may also have funds available
